
DESCRIPTION

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




Fig. 1 - Maximum Forward Voltage Drop Characteristics








Fig. 3 - Typical Junction Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage





Fig. 4 - Maximum Allowable Lead Temperature vs. Average Forward Current

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



Fig. 6 - Maximum Non-Repetitive Surge Current
